

SAFETY STATEMENT

It is the policy of Tug of War Ireland to promote standards of health and safety within the workforce which will lead to the avoidance or reduction in risks to health and safety, to continually improve our safety performance and to ensure that the best practicable methods of compliance with the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005, and associated legislation are achieved.

This Safety Statement, in accordance Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Acts 2005 and 2010 and the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (General Application) Regulations 2007 – 2016 outlines the policy of Tug of War Ireland in relation to the management of health and safety. Tug of War Ireland is committed to managing and conducting their work activities in such a way as to ensure, so far as is reasonably practicable, the safety, health and welfare at work of those who may be affected by their business activities.

This will be achieved by the following (so far as is reasonably practicable):

- the provision of a safe place of work, including safe access and egress;
- the provision of safe plant and equipment, articles and substances;
- the provision of safe systems of work;
- the provision of welfare facilities;
- the provision of appropriate information, instruction, training and supervision;
- determining and implementing appropriate preventative and protective measures;
- having regard to the general principles of prevention;
- the provision of emergency plans and procedures;
- reporting prescribed accidents and dangerous occurrences to the Health & Safety Authority; and
- Obtaining, when necessary, the services of a competent person to advise on health and safety.

The detailed arrangements for achieving these objectives are set out in our Safety Policy. Tug of War Ireland is also committed to managing and conducting work activities in such a way as to prevent, so far as is reasonably practicable, any improper conduct or behaviour (including bullying/harassment) likely to put the safety, health or welfare at work of employees at risk.

The Board has overall responsibility for health and safety within Tug of War Ireland. Employees share a responsibility with management in ensuring their own safety while at work. This Safety Statement requires the cooperation of all staff, visitors, contractors and others to enable Tug of War Ireland to discharge its responsibilities under law.

Tug of War Ireland is committed to upholding the standards outlined in this Safety Statement. Sufficient authority and resources, both financial and otherwise, will be made available to enable staff to carry out their responsibilities in a reasonable and efficient manner. All employees will be made aware of and have access to this Safety Statement and Policy. The Safety Statement will also be available to third parties where appropriate. Employees are encouraged to put forward suggestions for improvement to this document. The Safety Statement will be reviewed in light of experience and future developments within Tug of War Ireland.
